Turf Talk

While the golf course superintendent takes the lead in caring for our golf course, we as players have an obligation to help in the overall condition of the course too. Here are a few etiquette tips as it pertains to making sure our course stays in the best possible condition:

1. Make it a habit to properly repair 3 ball marks per green. This applies whether you made a ball mark or not. Click here to learn how- [Ball Mark Repair](#)
2. Keep all carts a minimum of 30ft away from all tee & green complexes.
3. When practicing on the course, avoid hitting multiple shots from the same location.

A Certified Handicap In Action

Let's say you average around 50-55 for a 9H round. Your certified handicap would be approximately 14.

Your friend that's been playing quite a bit longer than you shoots around 40 for a 9H round. Their certified handicap would be somewhere around 3.

You both go enjoy a 9H round on a sunny Saturday afternoon:

You fire $51 - 14$ (hdcp) = 37 (net score)
They fire $42 - 3$ (hdcp) = 39 (net score)
